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**Annual Report 2023-24**

This college has been working for years to impart excellent education and character building to the students in commerce stream. The college continues to climb the ladder of excellence by securing an 'A' grade in the 3rd cycle of the National Assessment Institute NAAC in 2021. Due to the continuous cooperation of the Sarvajani Education Society, the college has achieved many achievements in various fields. We are all gathered here to applaud the achievements of the learned teachers of the college, the accomplished non-academic members of the college administration and the students as a result of their sincere hard work throughout the year.

The role of IQAC committee has been pioneer in preparing future development plans of the college and organizing various activities. This year, this committee provided training on the management of College's ERP software – Easy Admin to academic and non-academic members and organized Computer Literacy training for students and non-academic staff. A seminar was organized by the IQAC committee to create awareness among the students about E-Waste Recycling. A total of 288 open category poor students were given scholarships from the Student and Teachers Welfare Fund of the college. An instalment of Rs. 50 lakhs of the RUSA grant was received this year which was utilized to equip the college technically by purchasing smart interactive boards for classrooms and computers for offices and laboratories.

The academic results of this college have always been higher than the university results. This year Assistant Professor Monika Chakraborty, serving in the Honors Department, received the Ph.D. degree, taking the number of teachers with Ph.D. degrees in the college to 22 and Number of Ph.D. guides to 7. Two other students also received their Ph.D. degrees under the guidance of faculty from the college. 5 students cleared the state level GSET exam in preparation for becoming a teacher. 2 students of B.Com. degree and 2 students of M.Com. degree stood first in the entire university and won prizes and medals. 3 international level and 3 national level paper presentations were made by the teachers of the college. 4 papers published in international journals. 7 teachers participated in workshops, 24 teachers participated in faculty development programs and 6 teachers participated in seminars and conferences. 50 students received training



on TALLY with GST Compliance software, 26 students received training on DELL/SCOPE and 59 students received training on Finishing School. 10 students of BANKIG special subject got Bank Internship and 199 students of Honors program got summer training. 25 students of TYBCom. Honors received training on "Online Trading on Financial Literacy" and 6 students cleared CA Foundation, 1 student CS Foundation and 1 student cleared CMA Foundation competitive exams.

Apart from academics, the college is bustling with various other activities throughout the year. This year cultural committee organized activities like talent hunt, stories through one act play, patriotic song competition, film screening workshop, poetry recitation contest, garba contest etc. In the youth festival held at the university, the students brought pride to the college by bagging first rank in group song competition, second rank in classical instrumental music competition and second rank in classical dance competition. Women Empowerment Cell organized talks by expert doctors on topics like "Breast Feeding Awareness" and "Polycystic Ovarian Diseases and Indian Women". 109 students participated in beauty care certificate course and chocolate making training and 88 students participated in self-defence training.

The National Service Scheme (NSS) Committee organized 35 different activities during the year like elocution Competition, Raksha Bandhan Celebration, Addiction Awareness, Cleanliness Campaign, Tree Plantation, Blood Donation, Voter Awareness Campaign, Hunnar Haat, etc. A special camp of NSS was organized at Bhimrad village from 7th October to 13th October, 2023, in which 168 students volunteered. NCC 5(Boys) and NCC 6(Girls) Gujarat Battalion conducted 69 parades during the year and students participated in 9 different camps. Cleanliness campaign, blood donation, organ donation, consumer awareness campaign etc. activities were organized by NCC unit. During the current year 3 cadets from NCC 5(boys) Gujarat Battalion were selected in State Reserve Police Force, 1 cadet in Border Security Force, 3 cadets as Agniveer, 3 cadets as Unarmed Public Guards and 1 Cadet as Armed Public Guards.

Planning Forum Committee organized lectures by guest speakers on topics like "Intellectual Property Right", "Consumer Awareness" and "Central Budget – 2024-25". 66 students of M. Com. T.Y.B.Com. participated in "3 Days Workshop on Financial Education for Investors" conducted by NISM and got certificates. Debate and Elocution Committee organizes several competitions throughout the year like Elocution Competition, Short Story Writing Competition, Book Review Competition, Online Quiz Competition, Slogan Writing. Essay competition on "Teachers' Significant Role in Shaping the Future of a Student" and Inter College Case Study Competition was organized as part of Teacher's Day celebrations from Prof. Suryakant Shah Nivrutti Pravrutti Bhandol, in which 54 students from different colleges participated. As a part of





promoting the creativity of the students, many competitions like Drawing Competition, Mehndi Competition, Gift and Rakhi Making, Matli and Chhatri Decoration were organized by the "Pushpanjali" Committee throughout the year.

Technical training was organized by SSIP and Innovation Club to impart technical knowledge to the students of Commerce stream in which 51 students were trained by a trainer from I-HUB, Ahmedabad. 4 college students received intensive training in a 7-day training organized by Entrepreneurship Development Institute of India. 94 students passed the Indian Culture Knowledge Examination conducted by Dev Sanskruti Vidyalyaya, Haridwar with excellent marks.

UDISHA Club conducted seminars and campus interviews on guidance for various competitive examinations of Govt. As a result a total of 92 students got selected in different companies. 22 students cleared a total of 153 online and offline certificate courses due to the encouragement received from the club. 73 students received training in training classes organized by Sankalp Career Academy for guidance in various government recruitment examinations.

In the field of sports too, the participation of the students of the college was outstanding. At the national level, Patel Rajvi won gold medal in cricket, Patel Harshil won gold medal in karate, Nagpure Silki won gold medal in 5 Km sea swimming competition and Silver medal in 10 Kms. sea swimming competition, Mehul Thackeray won silver medal in kho-kho and Sardhara Devanshi won bronze medal in Yogasana and brought pride to the college. In the state level competitions, students won 1 gold medal in karate, 1 gold medal in road cycling league, 1 gold medal in yoga, 1 silver medal in triathlon and 1 silver medal in wrestling. 1 silver and 1 bronze medal in grappling women category and 1 silver medal in rifle shooting in inter university level games. The college also played the role of organizer in several university competitions. Cash awards are given to NCC Best Cadet (Boys) and NCC Best Cadet (Girls) every year by Shri. Chetanbhai Desai, Alumnus of our college and LAC committee member to whom I express my gratitude from this forum.

In the current year, former Chairman of LAC Shri. Asimbhai Bakshi passed away tragically. Ex-Prin. G. B. Shah, Prof. D. M. Mehta and Prof. A. A. Shaikh also left us for heavenly abode. The College family lost a noble friend and teacher due to sudden demise of Prof. Surendrabhai Vasave. Pri. Dr. Martina Naronha retired. Prof.. Abhishek Gandhi, Working in Honors Department Joined K.P. Grant in Aid College as Teaching Assistant and Prof. Hufrish Deboo joined another college as a teaching assistant.



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
